



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## **Potential of India's Production Sphere**



India's production sphere is an important giver to the country's financial growth. It accounts for about 15% of India's gross domestic product (GDP) and provides employment to about 12% of the country's workforce. The sphere is extremely diverse and includes many industries such as textiles, pharmaceuticals, automobiles and consumer rare goods. In recent

years, the Government of India has taken several initiatives to boost the production sphere. The 'Make in India' campaign is one of the major initiatives aimed at increasing the share of the production sphere in the country's GDP and boosting the growth of domestic production. The government has also set up several Special Economic Zones (SEZs) to draw overseas capital in the area.

Apart from this, the production sphere in India continues to face several challenges, including lack of substructure, scarcity of trained workers and troubles in getting funds. Moreover, the sphere has also been affected by a slowdown in global demand and increasing competition from countries like China. However, this scenario also offers huge growth opportunities in the sphere and is expected to play a significant role in the growth of the Indian economy through sustained reforms.

India's production sphere needs up-gradation and restructurings for becoming worldwide viable. Absence of actual, stretchy and embattled policy provision along with loyal actions like the advancement of set-up and edification would mean the sluggishness of the sphere. The government needs to discourse the fundamental glitches for the breakthrough ingenuities like Make in India and Skill India to exertion and production sphere to grow.

The lockdown forced the corporate world to retreat to their houses and continue its operations. The impact was global and multinational companies went through an extremely rough phase with respect to managing their employees, and the company, and ensuring their survival in the market. The Indian Economy itself suffered a loss of over Rs 19 Lakh Crore, and sustaining any sort
